


## Purpose of Objectives Analysis

- Describes a situation after the problem have been resolved
- Identifies the means-end relationship
- Visualizes the means-end relationship in a diagram referred to as an "Objective tree"







# Analysis of Objectives









## **Basic Considerations**

Does the objective statement make sense as an "improved condition?" (realistic?; possible?)

- Have we left out anything in our problem analysis that will need to be addressed to achieve this desired "improved condition?"
- What do stakeholders think or how might they react?

What might be possible risks and assumptions?



## **Alternatives Analysis**

- Used to identify alternative means of achieving the desired situation or development objective
- Assess the feasibility of each alternative
- Agree on a project strategy




# **Criteria for Choosing Alternatives**

### Desirability

- Acceptability of the change
- Probability of achieving the project purpose and its results
- Cost
- Timeframe
- Risks
- Sustainability


