Hill Water Supply **"Nam Lin"** Project from HM King Vajiralongkorn Phra Vajiraklaochaoyuhua's kindness.



Could you please tell us more about this Nam Lin Project?

With HM King's kindness, and intention to "continuing, preserving, and building upon the royal legacy" after the late King Bhumibol, NEDA is considering the importance of local communities and social sustainable development towards improvement of quality of life. This good intention results in the assistance on Hill Water Supply Project to honour the King Rama X on His Majesty coronation. The project is located in Kiw Tang Village, Chomphet, Luang Phrabang, Lao PDR which is the same area of Chomphet-Luang Phrabang Road Constructuion Project. The village was habitat of Lao Soong indigenous people who were affected by expropriation caused by NEDA's assistance project. The villagers were migrated to designated area where is quite far away from water supply. NEDA, with intention to solve the problem, provided the assistance to construct this Hill Water Supply Project in 2 months and helped improve quality of life of Lao Soong village in accordance to government policy of sustainable development especially in the aspect of water sanitary and hill water supply management. NEDA hopes that the project will be sufficiently utilised for consumption and agriculture. This Hill Water Supply is also known as "Nam Lin" Project by Laotians.





Please tell us about construction of clean water supply and how to maintain environmental sanitary.

The government of Lao PDR migrated 70 households or 238 persons of Lao Soong villagers who earlier inhabited on the foothills of northern Lao PDR. Their original area is on the construction route of Hongsa-Chiangman Road Construction Project. The villagers, who do agriculture and farming, lacked of clean water supply. Therefore, NEDA decided to provide assistance to construct Hill Water Supply to improve their lives. NEDA cooperated with Lao World Engineering and Construction Co., Ltd. to search for natural water resource from Phu Huay Kai which is located in the forest near the village. Since there is abundant of water flows from Phu Huay Kai, NEDA built the concrete reservoir on the hill at kilometre 60 to contain water. The construction area is the new habitat of Lao Soong or Mong community who moved from 1,200 metre-high above the sea level hills to this area. The concrete reservoir is 5 metres in width, 5 metres in length, and 2 metres in height with capacity to contain 50,000 litres of water. The reservoir has 53 millimetres tube to transfer water from its origin to the villages with 2,800 metres in distance. After, water will be distributed to 9 households for whole-year consumption.



What is your expectation from the project and what is the plan to continue this achievement?





To genuinely realise the existing problem and information, I spent time with villagers at the project area and talk with them. The main problem was about communication between us and indigenous villagers. The villagers needed sometimes to really understand this development project. It might be hard for them but the project needed to be pushed for greater achievement. The achievement must also be in line with their sufficient way of life. Apart from construction period, the project needs management. I am very proud that this village has been improved in better way compare to the past. I hope this project affect the community in the best way. However, for sustainable development, the community need to protect the environment, maintain the physical construction, and value their water supply from natural source.

Nan-Xaiyabuli-Luang Phrabang Route with More Time Saving

Nan Province is the northern province of Thailand borders with Lao PR. Its landscape is surrounded by high mountains. Nan Province has its popularity and always attracts tourists with its unique culture and lively old town.



Hongsa-Chiangman Road Construction Project is 114 kilometres from Huay Kon, Chaloem Phra Kiat District, Nan Province to Nam Ngern Border, Xaiyabuli, Lao PDR. The project starts at Baan Na Pung, Hongsa, Xaiyabuli and ends at Mekong River, Chiangman, Luang Phrabang, where is the World Heritage. The project also promotes sister-city strategy between Nan Province and Luang Phrabang by decreasing traveling time from 6 hours to 3 hours. This time-saving route attracts more tourists. Apart from connectivity promotion, this route also facilitates tourism, trade, and investment between Nan Province and Luang Phrabang. Those two cities have many natural and cultural attractions and are well-known for their historical background. Plus, within the time of 2-3 years, there will be the Mekong crossing bridge construction in Luang Phrabang which is not far from the airport. The route is expected to be charming like other routes.

This road development project is the opportunity to connect Nan Province to Luang Phrabang. The route can help generate trade value and other economic activities along the route.

In Luang Phrabang, there are many activities to enjoy. People can pay respect at Phra Bang, enjoy Lan Chang artworks (Ock Pop Tok), help preserve local textile of indigenous groups, visit Phra That Phu See to see sunset and the city below, visit Wat Vissounnarath which situates Phra That Mak Mo, enjoy the biggest and most beautiful waterfalls in Luang Phrabang called Guangxi waterfalls, sail a boat along Baan Anne to see Tad Sae waterfalls, sip original Lao coffee, dress like local people offering sticky rice to monk, and shop at night market.

Amazing YGN 2019: It can be said that this is the first time in Myanmar which view along the route is something to enjoy. Myanmar has the culture of ASEAN cuisine in it , one of the famous national dish is Lahpet or tea leaf salad. This dish is appetizer mostly served in celebration or festival to express the host's wealth. The first meal in Myanmar may be tough but you will get through this. A good helper during street food meal is hot tea, which can be found throughout your journey.

> **Mo Hin Ga,** Burmese rice noodles made from mung bean flour boiled in fish stewed soup, seasoned with local herbs like turmeric, lemon grass, and pepper. So, its taste will be rich with herbal scent. This dish is quite popular street food that Burmese has as breakfast. It costs around 200-500 Kyat (around 6-15 THB). The dish will be served with sliced banana, fried bean, boiled egg, sliced fried fish, chinese donut, and coriander on top, seasoned with chili and lemon.

NEDA and ASEAN Thailand 2019

With ASEAN Chairmanship of Thailand in 2019, H.E. Gen. Prayuth Chan-Ocha, the Prime Minister, has introduced "Advancing Partnership for Sustainability" as the official theme for the ASEAN Chairmanship this year. By the theme announced; partnership means promoting seamless connectivity towards ASEAN; advancing means preparing for ASEAN digital era; and sustainability means sustainable development to achieve sustainable ASEAN.



Neighbouring Countries Economic Development Cooperation Agency (Public Organization) (NEDA), as a development partner providing assistance in connectivity and infrastructure development to bordered neighbouring countries, namely Cambodia, Lao PDR, and Myanmar. The assistance cooperation aims to promote trade, investment, and tourism between Thailand and its neighbouring countries. Presently, Thailand is carrying out the feasibility study and detailed design of the Development of Two-lane Road Connecting Dawei SEZ to Thai-Myanmar Border Project. The said project is in line with the Development of ASEAN Highway No. 123 Project which en-route from Phu Nam Ron border, Karnchanaburi Province to Dawei, Myanmar. The project is part of the Master Plan on ASEAN Connectivity 2025, a guideline and mechanism to promote ASEAN connectivity concretely.

The achievement of the project will help reduce traveling time from 5 hours to 2 hours from Phu Nam Ron border to Dawei. The route is also a vital strategic route connecting 2 main oceans; Indian Ocean, through Andaman Sea by the Myanmar's deep sea port; and Pacific Ocean, through Gulf of Thailand by Laem Chabang deep sea port. Such connection can also be through Southern Economic Corridor (SEC) which is part of the Eastern Economic Corridor (EEC) of Thailand, through Cambodia, Vietnam by Cai Mep deep sea port and Qui Nhon deep sea port to Pacific Ocean in the area of South China Sea. Connecting those 2 oceans helps decrease commodity shipment to 6-8 days which is much shorter than traveling through the Strait of Malacca which takes around 16-18 days of shipment. The route is potentially to be the world's new trade gateway with ability to connect big market like India and other regions like Europe, Middle East, and Africa.

In addition, NEDA is aware of the difficulty in harmonisation of regulations which may cause lack of effectiveness towards physical connectivity. Hence, NEDA is very keen to provide technical and financial assistance for development of ASEAN Single Window (ASW) in neighbouring countries (Lao PDR and Myanmar) to effectively facilitate international trade, save management cost and relevant resources.

NEDA's assistance project will fulfil upper ASEAN's current missing links according to ASEAN Chairmanship official theme of Thailand this year. As we can see that we promote "Partnership" towards Seamless ASEAN. Plus, the project also promotes ASEAN supply chain and enhance economic cooperation among ASEAN.
